Show Politicians that Educators are a Strong Force at the Polls!

- Every vote matters! In 2010, Rep. Donna Howard (D-Austin) won the election by only 4 votes out of about 52,000 cast.
- In 2014, Texas ranked dead last in voter turnout. Only about 10% of eligible voters voted in the primary, and about 30% in the general election.
- In the March 2016 primary, with increased educator turnout, Texas moved up to next to last, ahead of Louisiana.

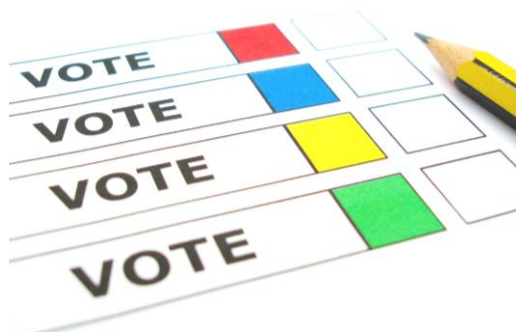

Register to Vote

You are eligible to register if:

- You are a United States citizen;
- You are a resident of the county where you submit the application;
- You are at least 18 years old on Election Day;
- You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole); and
- You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.
