2020 Primary Election

- Last day to register: Feb. 3, 2020
- Early voting: Feb. 18–28, 2020
- Tuesday, Mar. 3, 2020

2020 Primary Runoff Election

- Last day to register: April 27, 2020
- Early voting: May 18–22, 2020
- Tuesday, May 26, 2020

2020 General Election

- Last day to register: Oct. 5, 2020
- Early voting: Oct. 19–30, 2020
- Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020





Educator Do's and Don'ts

Do's:


- Encourage students, staff, parents and community members to vote.
- Share factual information about voter registration, polling locations, dates, and hours of voting.
- Teach about civics, citizenship, and voting. Register voters, hold non-partisan candidate forums, and make sure staff and students have time to vote.
- Advocate for the interest of Texas public education, as long as the advocacy does not use public resources or time to campaign for a specific candidate, political party, or ballot measure.

DON'T USE PUBLIC FUNDS (INCLUDING SCHOOL DISTRICT RESOURCES AND TIME) TO SUPPORT OR OPPOSE A SPECIFIC CANDIDATE, PARTY, OR BALLOT MEASURE. The 86th legislative session was "the education session" because educators voted.

Voter turnout increased 60% between 2014 and 2018.


Texas Voter Turnout
